

Let's Speak in Nanbu! Part 2

Believe it or not, even though Japan is a small country, it has variety of colorful accents and dialects. Not far from Misawa--- the area from southern Aomori to northern Iwate Prefectures-one of the main dialects is Nanbu-ben (ben 年 means "dialect; speech -type"). Here are some useful expressions!

Water is cold now!

みず しゃっこくなった Mizu shako-ku na-tta

Water: みず Mizu

Cold: しゃっこい Sha-kko-i

ゆき こいで あるく Yu-ki koide A-ru-ku

Shove through (walk through): こぐ (こいで) Ko-gu

Snow: ゆき Yu-ki
